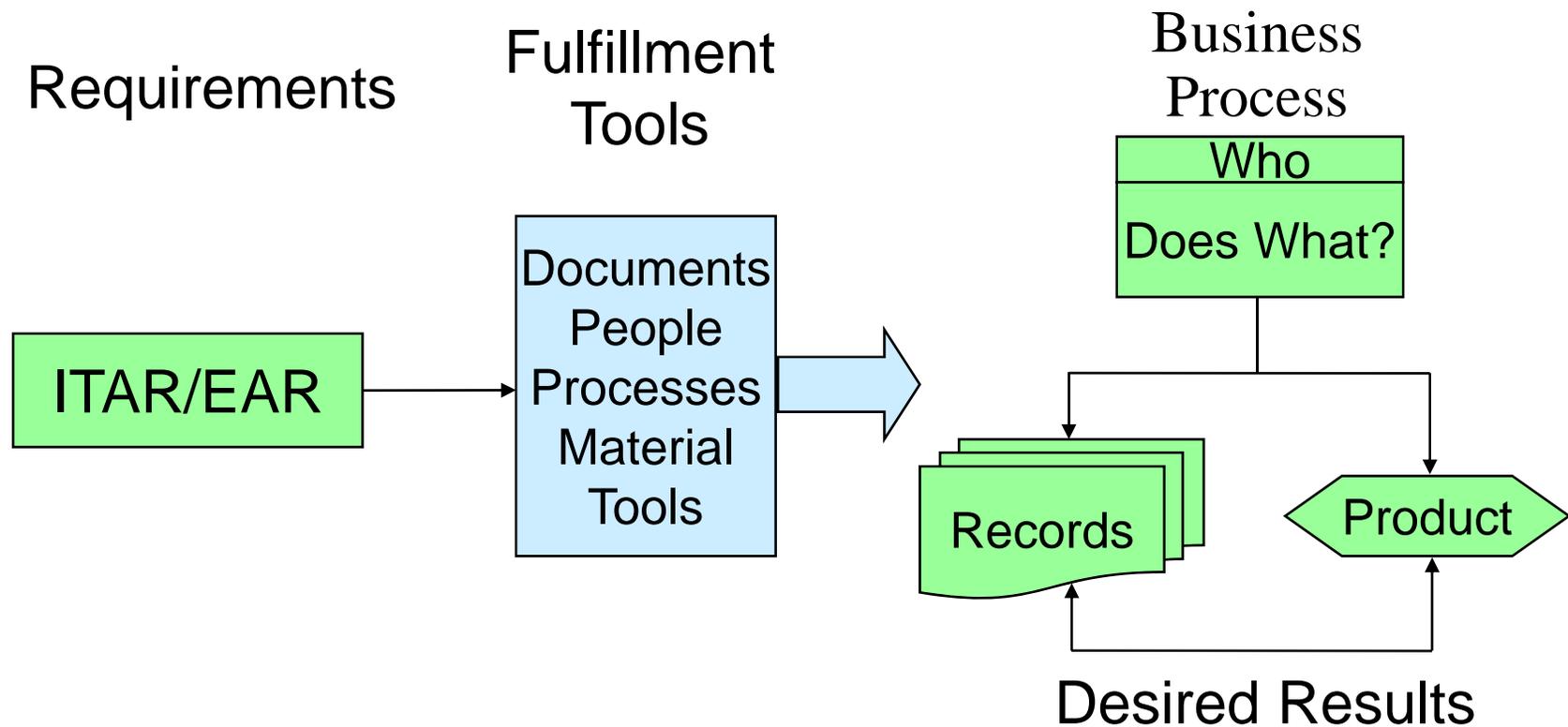

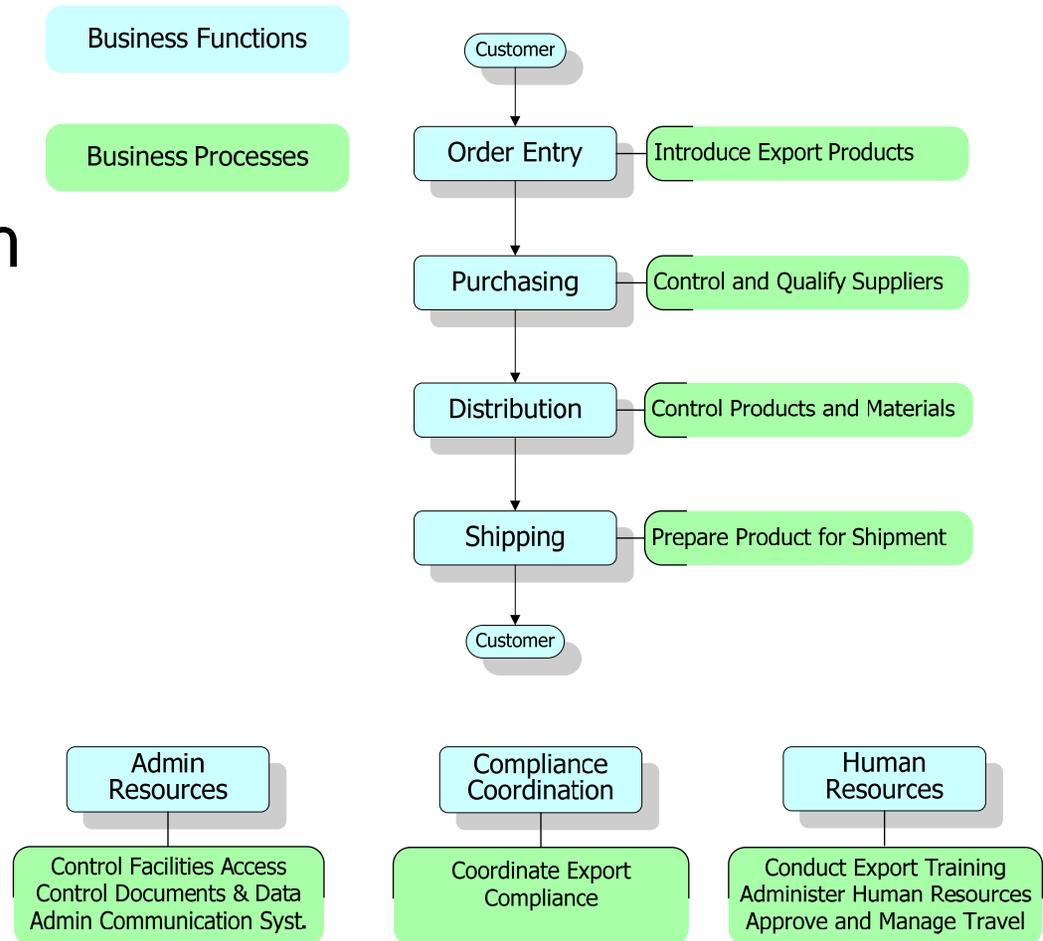

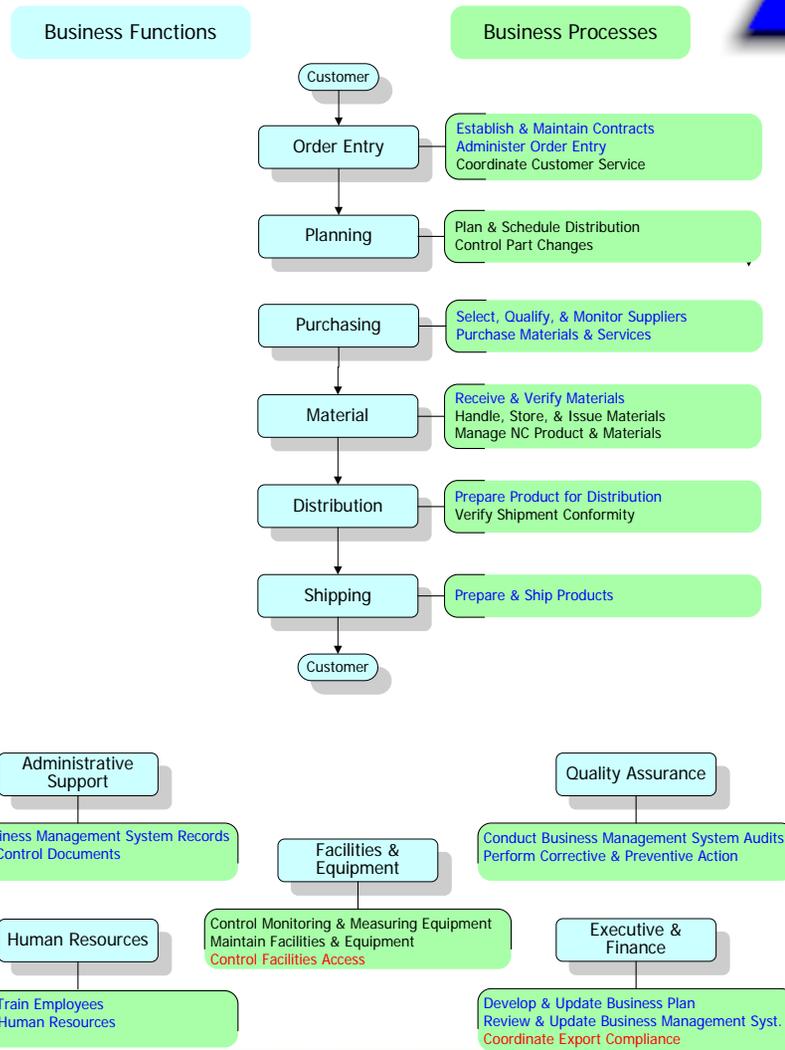

Define Requirements



Start by defining requirements

U.S. Export Administration Regulations (EAR), Title 15
Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 730-774

U.S. International Traffic in Arms Regulations (ITAR),
Title 22 Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 120-130

Determine Applicable Requirements

Develop a plan

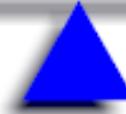
- Locate available resources

- Document ECMS processes
- Implement processes
- Determine compliance

Establishing a Plan

ITAR/EAR Implementation Plan

- Determine applicable requirements related to company operation
- Develop time line plan for project
- Attend Export Compliance training courses
- Identify and locate required resources
- Secure assistance from applicable resources
- Establish approach to satisfy adequate compliance with requirements
- Identify needed processes for ITAR/EAR compliance
- Identify resource for process development and documentation
- Develop and document required processes
- Verify compliance with applicable ITAR/EAR requirements
- Adjust as needed to assure continued compliance

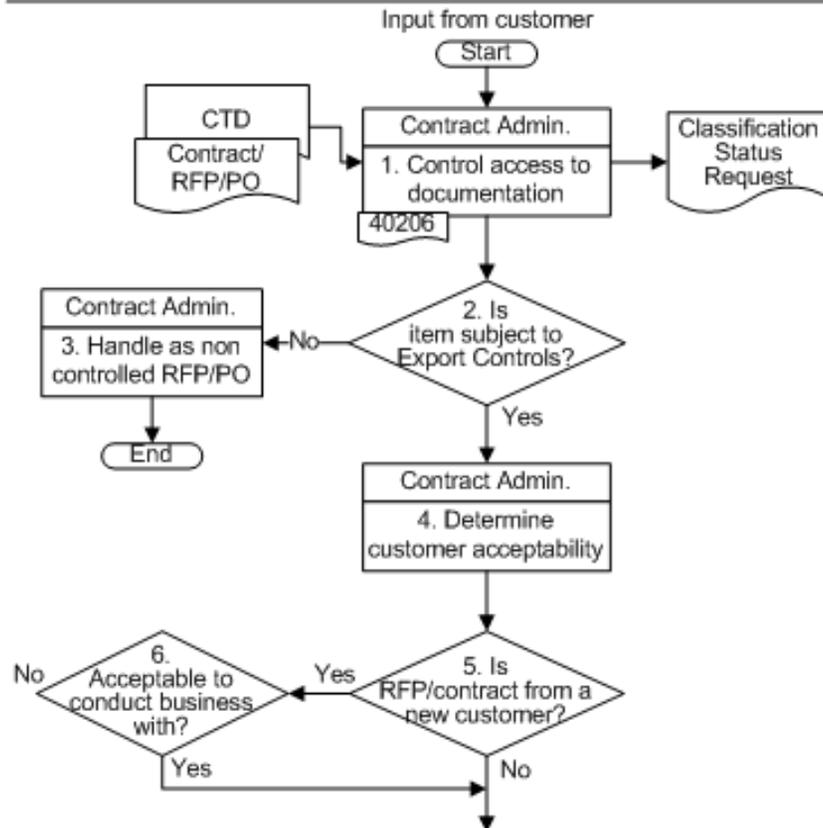

Mapping EC Business Processes

Introduce Export Programs



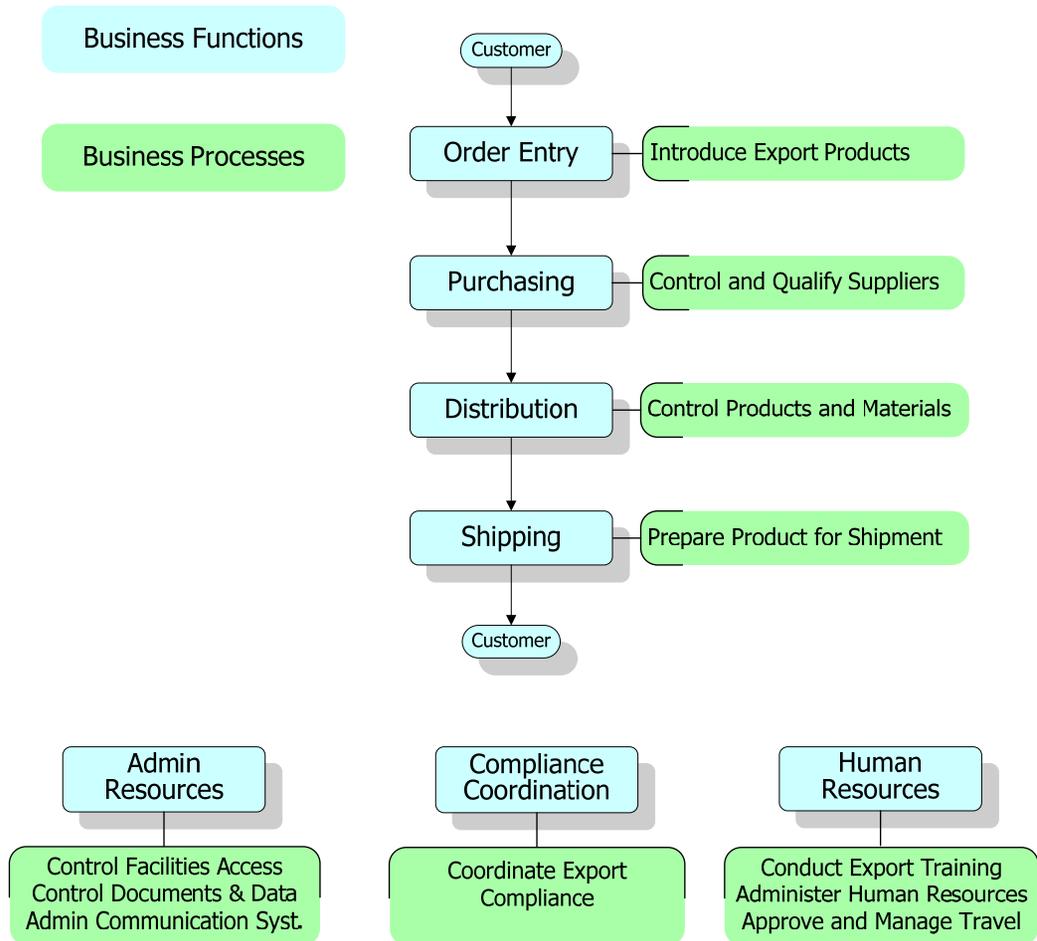
1. Locate all technical documentation sent with the PO/RFP/contract and place it in a secure location. Determine if technical data received is likely subject to Export Controls and store this data in a secure location designated by the Export Compliance Officer (ECO). If technical data is received that is not identified as Export Controlled but appears that it is, send an Export Classification Status Request, 40206 to the customer.

3. Handle RFP/PO/Contract as a non Export Controlled customer request.

4. Determine status of customer (new or existing) and collect all available information. Submit new customer information to the ECO and request a determination of acceptability to conduct business with the potential customer. Review results of ECO's investigation and reach conclusion on acceptability to do business.

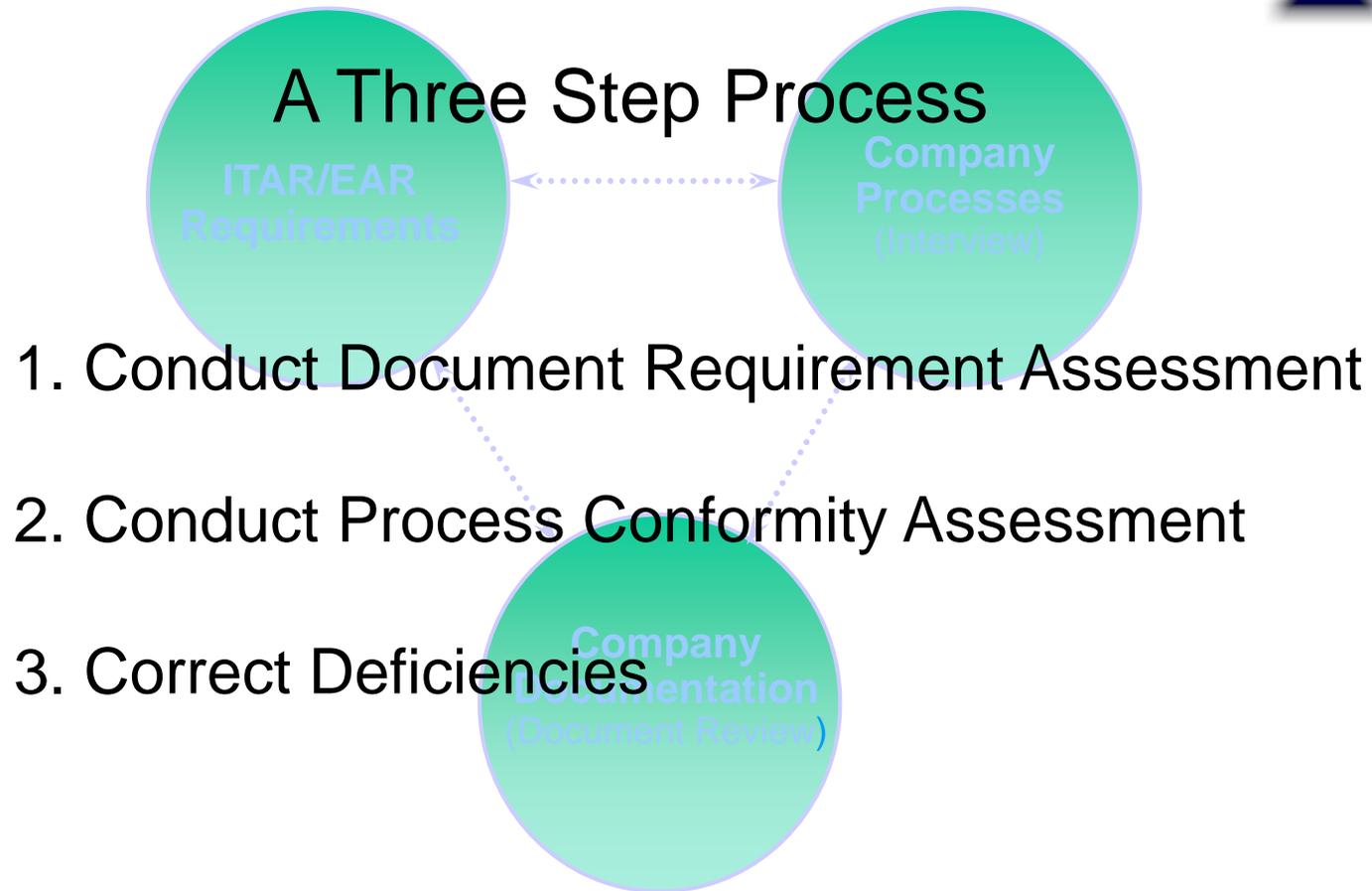
