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INVENTORY MANAGEMENT

Inventory management is a component of Supply Chain Management. This Lean QA webinar focuses on learning control of ordering, storage and use of raw materials or components that a company uses to produce items it sells as well as control and management of finished goods.

For most organizations, goods are delivered to the receiving area as raw material, components, partially finished or finished goods. After a few process steps and data gathering, the inventory is transferred to the accepted product area, stock for storage and then issued to the production line to be converted to finished goods or if the inventory is already in the form of finished goods, it's pulled from storage, inspected to meet the requirements and shipped out to the customer.

In order to plan for inventory, you need to know the inventory planning process, types of inventory, how to evaluate demand, ops planning, assessment of resources, inventory objectives and all the terminologies associated with inventory e.g., lead times, Economic order quantity (EOQ), Bill of Materials (BOM), Min-Max, Safety Stock, carrying cost, Valuation, Visibility, Replenishment and Demand Forecasting etc. Learning about Data collection and creating balanced scorecard to monitor inventory levels for operations, Obsolescence, and Inventory Accuracy is equally important in the inventory management process.

In this workshop, the participants will learn all aspects of the inventory management including but not limited to: Types of Inventory, Inventory Planning Process, Evaluating demand, Ops planning, Creating balanced inventory scorecards, Cycle time measures, Fill rate, Inventory ABC classification, Master scheduling and Inventory Accuracy using cycle counts.
