# ASACB UPDATE



# REVISION TO AS9120

The AS9120 rewrite team had a goal to have the draft revision available by July/August 2023.

- This team met every six weeks beginning in August 2022.
- The flow down of AS9100 requirements were removed and made more distribution centric.
- The IAQG is now viewing the AS9120 standard with equal weighting as 9100 and 9110.
- The team has 100% of the draft written and is performing a final review before submitting to the IAQG for review and comment before its release.

The release timeline for the new revision was originally set for end of 2023. This has been pushed back to fourth quarter 2024 / first quarter 2025 as a direct result to update ISO 9001. The ISO updates will need to be incorporated into the AS standards.



# EXPANSION OF ACCREDITED PROGRAMS

The applications for expansion of ASACB's accreditation with ANSI National Accreditation Board (ANAB) were filed on May 31, 2023.

- ISO 14001 – Environmental Management Systems
- ISO 27001 – Information Security Management Systems

ASACB is in the process of interviewing several auditors for both new programs. As with the AS standard there is a specific set of experience and acumen required to be a auditor under both new programs.

ASACB has several certified organizations that are seeing flow down of these standards by their customer. We have existing clients already agreeing to be our expansion audits for us to secure the accreditation approvals.

# AS9104-1a Transition



# Transition

ASACB as of March 2023 was one of ten out of 40 certification bodies that have filed their transition application for AS9104-1a and PBS/RP with ANAB.

- Mandatory transition is March 31, 2024.
- All audits will have to be performed to these new requirements.
- ASACB will fully transition once 75% of our auditors passes the required training.

Highlights of changes that impact the certified organization.

- New tool called OCAP which allows for audit duration and time calculation
  - Tool allows for exclusions to be taken and justified by location
  - Tool automatically calculates a second and third standards time at 50% of primary standard
  - Exclusions may be applied to the second and third standard.
  - Reduction in audit time can not exceed 30%
- Site structure aligns with ISO 17021 of single and multiple site.
  - Any existing site structures classified as several or campus will change to multiple
  - ASACB has no several site structures.
  - This means all campus structures will go to multiple site and will have increased audit time



# AS9104 Requirement for Client to Provide Pre-Audit Data

- 9.1.9 AQMS certified organizations shall work with the CB to resolve any issues regarding access limitations to the organization (e.g., resolve by limiting the scope of certification).
- 9.1.10 AQMS certified organizations shall provide data required by this standard, to their CB prior to initial, surveillance, and recertification audits for the completion of the OCAP analysis.

**NOTE:** Failure to provide accurate and timely data may result in the issuance of a nonconformity (under section 4 for not complying with contract requirements) by the CB and/or prevent certification.
